MAFC supports the development of freight-related transportation operations, facilities and freight-related policy, and their linkages with economic and community development. TPF-5(396) is the 3rd phase/iteration of the MAFC pooled fund.

MAFC pooled fund members are the 10 states of the Mid America Association of State Transportation Officials (MAASTO).

- Complete literature review and data collection for COVID-19 Disruptions: Freight System and Agency Operational Changes Affecting Freight Planning. Includes budget and timeline.
- Complete EDL project interviews and data analysis.
- Work with MAASTO CAV Team to develop strategic plan for freight and CAV.
- Coordinate and execute a 1-yr extension for the MAFC TPF.

- MAFC continues to work with HNTB, Cambridge Systematics and states to pursue national adoption of TPIMS efforts through NCHRP project.
- TRB Research Review publication of the MAFC report, *Identification of Urban Truck Parking Locations in the MAASTO Region (2019)*. Pending release.
