- MAFC continues to participate with the MAASTO CAV team and will work to provide MAFC member perspectives regarding strategic planning, operations, and policy.

Anticipated work next quarter:

- Conduct project meetings with technical representatives to support work on Marine Freight Development in the MAASTO Region: Market Identification, Valuation, and Employment Using Geospatial Analysis and All Hazards Assessments of Major Freight Corridors in the MAASTO Region Phase 1.
- Complete buffer analysis and begin port stakeholder interviews for *Marine Freight Development in the MAASTO Region: Market Identification, Valuation, and Employment Using Geospatial Analysis.*
- Complete route selection for All Hazards Assessments of Major Freight Corridors in the MAASTO Region Phase 1.
- Continue TPIMS data warehousing and support of TPIMS.
- Complete MAFC quarterly virtual meeting sessions.
- Begin planning for MAFC annual meeting in 2024.
- Complete reimbursements and billing for annual meeting.

Significant Results:

- MAFC state participants will support assessment and development of the freight related CAV strategic initiatives.
- Successful annual meeting with participation from all 10 MAASTO states.

- Illinois is working to join the TPIMS data feeds, which will bring the participating states to 9.
