Project Description:

This program is a cooperative effort of participating state departments of transportation (DOTs) and other (traditional and non-traditional) organizations with a vested interest in traffic safety. This long-term partnership will support an evolving and integrated project portfolio developed and revised each year by the partners and will complement other related research activities. Together, these projects will accelerate the development and delivery of tools and services to transform the national, state, and community-level traffic safety culture. The goal of this transformation is to support the Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) vision with sustainable traffic safety solutions.

In this context, the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) is partnering with the Center for Health and Safety Culture (CHSC) at Montana State University to (1) conduct research to solve specific culture-based traffic safety problems, (2) create training and education materials to enhance workforce understanding and application of traffic safety culture methods, and (3) provide technology transfer of best practices in traffic safety culture methods to all stakeholders. Together, these efforts will support the transformation of traffic safety culture within the families, communities, and organizations of participating states.

This project is in phase 2; the first phase was TPF-5(309) Partnership for the Transformation of Traffic Safety Culture. The current phase ended on September 30, 2024. Commitments for Phase 3 (solicitation 1621) were met as of 10/21/24 and the new pooled fund study is TPF-5(547).

Program Fund Updates

As of September 30, 2024, states that have committed to funding this pooled fund are CT, GA, IA, ID, IL, KS, KY, LA, MI, MN, MS, MT, NV, TX, UT, VT, and WA. Contract Status Traffic Safety Culture – Phase 2 Management Support (8882-444-17, 18, 21, 24, & 25)

During this quarter, the CHSC staff provided support and helped facilitate the August quarterly meeting. CHSC sent out the Webex invites, worked with MDT on agenda development, recorded the meeting, and took meeting notes. Meeting notes for the quarterly meeting were sent to MDT for distribution and posting to the TPF website. CHSC developed the quarterly report for April through June for MDT and the board's review, which has been posted to the TPF website. The Center staff provided a webinar to promote Phase 3 on July 10th. The webinar has been posted on CHSC's YouTube page and has 65 views. The Center also developed a one-page electronic handout and email language for the board to promote Phase 3 and utilized their marketing channels to distribute promotional materials.

Resources and Tools to Reduce Multi-Risk Driving Behaviors (8882-444-20)

During this quarter, the CHSC completed revisions of the final report, PowerPoint, resource document, and poster. They conducted the final webinar on August 28th, 2024. The webinar was posted on CHSC's YouTube page and has had 258 views.

Resources and Tools to Improve Pedestrian Safety (8882-444-22)

During this quarter, the CHSC team completed revisions to the Task 3 report and resource document and began work on Task 4.

Understanding Aggressive Driving and Ways to Reduce It – Phase 2 (8882-444-26)

During this quarter, the CHSC recruited interview participants for Task 1. Fourteen interviews were conducted in September and the team began cleaning data transcripts. The CHSC also created and launched a survey to collect feedback from the board members as part of Task 3. The survey was shared with the Board during the August quarterly meeting and in follow-up emails. CHSC also requested to increase the budget for Qualtrics panels in Task 3 due to increased costs charged from Qualtrics. This budget request was approved on September 27th and an amendment was issued on September 30th.
