Project Description:

WAQTC is focused in three main areas: Standardizing test methods (WAQTC, AASHTO, and ASTM), accreditation of the Transportation Technician Qualification Program (TTQP), and working together on national programs of significance including research, training, and technology deployment. Refer to the WAQTC website: https://www.waqtc.org/

The WAQTC Mission Statement is to: "Provide leadership in the pursuit of continuously improving quality in transportation construction." An Executive Board consisting of at least one representative of each member agency governs the WAQTC. Through our partnership, we will:

- promote an atmosphere of trust, cooperation, and communication between government agencies and the private sector
- respond in a unified and consistent manner to identified quality improvement needs and new technologies that impact the products that we provide
- provide a forum to promote uniform test standards
- provide highly skilled, knowledgeable materials sampling and testing technicians
- provide reciprocity for Qualified testing technicians among accredited Agencies

TPF-5(558) funds the continued development and refinement of the TTQP, including:

- Maintaining and revising the six existing WAQTC TTQP training and certification courses in coordination with member state agencies;
- Distributing training materials, including training manuals, PowerPoint presentations, and written and practical exams, to member states;
- · Maintaining the WAQTC website; and
- Developing and presenting proposed revisions and new standards to the AASHTO Subcommittee on Materials.

June 2025: Note that the new TPF-5(558) pooled fund (initially solicitation #1636) for the 2026-2029 version of the WAQTC is now available on the pooledfund.org website. WAQTC partner organizations are encouraged to post their 2026-2029 funding commitments on the new pooled fund number on the TPF website. Then the 2026 funding transfers to UDOT would be expected to start around Oct./Nov. 2025. The minimum expected partner commitment for the new phase is \$10,000 per year, or \$40,000 total. We will transition from TPF-5(476) to the new TPF-5(558) during 2025 and early 2026.

UDOT worked on getting the new pooled fund TPF-5(558) set up on the pooledfund.org website, in the FMIS system, and in the UDOT financial system. UDOT also informed partner states on the previous pooled fund about the new pooled fund and the opportunity to commit funds on the new one.
