<i>Objective</i> <i>The purpose of the WPPP is to provide a partnering forum for promoting effective pavement preservation strategies through the following objectives: (1) provide funds for a multi-day annual workshop for discussion and exchange of information and knowledge about each state's pavement preservation program, (2) provide a means to define, support and share technology of mutual interest, (3) provide funds for formal training presentations during the annual workshop, and (4) provide funds for special studies, investigations, research and training.</i>				

Project Progress:

The second meeting was held on April 8, 2008 in conjunction with the California Pavement Preservation Conference. Discussion involved the by-laws, defining pavement preservation, and FHWA, industry, and local agency involvement. Coordination with the other preservation partnerships was discussed. Reports from Washington, California, and FHWA were given; Hawaii, Montana, and Nevada were not present.

Montana DOT has joined this pooled fund.

Caltrans funding still is not available through this pooled fund.

New Period Proposed Activity:

It was proposed that the next meeting be held in April 2009 in coordination with the California Pavement Preservation Conference.
