WORK COMPLETED:

- Project 1 (DOT Organizations, Roles, and Missions for Security and Emergency Management): Start of
 Work meeting was conducted. Additional meeting was held with the contractor to assist in final
 production of a questionnaire that was distributed to selected State DOT representatives for the purpose
 of gathering samples of various organizations and organizational activities. Returned information was
 analyzed and additional questions were prepared for follow-up discussions.
- Project 2 (Evacuation Principles): Preparation of the Statement of Work continued.
- Project 3 (HSEEP for DOTs): On hold pending identification of funds.
- Project 4 (NIMS for Frontline Transportation Workers): Start of Work meeting was conducted. Additional meeting was held with contractor to discuss comments on initial draft work book developed by the contractor. Second draft was sent to select States for review and comment. Comment period lasts until 17 July.
- Project 5 (Component Level Risk Management Introduction/Familiarization): Contractor attended and recorded a workshop conducted in New Jersey. Tapes of the workshop were transcribed to obtain the course script. A draft course content map was developed.
